ORDER:-

In the references first read above, the State Planning Commission has recommended among others, to “upgrade the Sick Newborn Care Unit” in 18 centers in the State in order to reduce NMR in the State.

2. Based on the above recommendation, the Directorate of Medical Education has forwarded the proposal and requested the Government to accord administrative and financial sanction for a sum of Rs.10,00,08,000/- for “up-gradation of the Sick Newborn Care Unit” (SNCU) in 18 centers in the State in order to reduce NMR in the State.

3. The Director of Medical Education has identified the 18 centers in the State for installing the Neonatal Ventilators and Continuous positive air way pressure (CPAP). She has, therefore, requested the Government to sanction a sum of Rs. 10,00,08,000/- (Rupees Ten Crore Eight Thousand only) for installation of the Neonatal Ventilators and Continuous positive air way pressure (CPAP) in the above 18 centers under Tamil Nadu Innovation Initiatives (TAN-II) Scheme.

4. The Government have examined the proposal of the Director of Medical Education in detail and accord administrative and financial sanction for a sum of Rs.10,00,08,000/- (Rupees Ten Crore Eight Thousand only) for installation of the Neonatal Ventilators and Continuous positive air way

pressure (CPAP) in the following 18 centers under Tamil Nadu Innovation Initiatives (TAN-II) Scheme. The cost details are as detailed below:-

Neonatal Ventilators for the following centres:- The DME side 11 centres (Kanyakumari, Trichy, Tanjavur, Vellore, RSRM, Kasturibai Gandhi Hospital (KGH), ICH, IOG, Salem, Dharmapuri and Karur) (11x5=55 units) and The DM&RHS side 7 centres (Kumbakonam, Tiruppur, Thirupathur, Pudukottai, Namakkal, Kanchipuram and Tiruvallur). Each centre needs 5 ventilators. Each unit cost Rs.8,70,000. (7x5=35 units)	55X8,70,000 = 4,78,50,000	35X8,70,000 =3,04,50,000
2.	Continuous positive air way pressure (CPAP) for the above centres, 5 in number of each unit.	55X1,80,000 = 99,00,000/-	35X1,80,000 = 63,00,000/-
3.	Disposable circuits for ventilators for all the centres (recurring expenses) per year. Each unit cost around Rs.850. Expected utilization of disposable unit per centre 360 unit per year.	11X360x850 = 33,66,000/-	7X360x850 =21,42,000/-
